

BUILDING TIES TO GOVERN

Although surveys pointed to +15% difference between the main candidates, the final 7.4% points to the future need of negotiation that the new government will have to manage as it takes office next December, mainly given the new and stable Congress configuration.



COORDINATED TRANSITION

After admitting defeat, Mauricio Macri announced that he would work in an institutional and coordinated transition with the president-elect, Alberto Fernández. Both will hold a work meeting on Monday morning.



THE IMPORTANCE OF THE PROVINCE OF BUENOS AIRES

The province managed again to impose the weight of its representation in the electoral register above other relevant urban districts, such as Mendoza, Córdoba, City of Buenos Aires, Entre Ríos or Santa Fe, where Macri won the election.

PROVINCIAL ELECTIONS

7.95% of national register

CITY OF BUENOS AIRES

The results of the general elections have ratified the trend observed during the primaries. The current mayor of the City of Buenos Aires reached a wider difference as he obtained 55% of the votes, despite the optimistic forecasts of the Frente de Todos that looked forward to reaching a second round in the district. With this result, the "Cambiemos" administration reached its fourth consecutive term in the City, maintaining the influence on one of the most important districts.

PROVINCE OF BUENOS AIRES

Despite the considerable growth of the governor Maria Eugenia Vidal, this was not enough to shorten the distance from the candidate of the *Frente de Todos*, Axel Kicillof, who reached 52% of the votes. María Eugenia Vidal showed her willingness to begin the transition process in the district. The result reflected the strong polarization observed at the national level. The victory of Axel Kicilloff represents the recovery of the district by the Peronist Party.

PROVINCE OF CATAMARCA

The results confirmed the advantage by Raúl Jalil in the primaries when he obtained a wide difference over Roberto Gómez. Following the trend observed at the national level, the candidate of *Juntos por el Cambio* improved his performance, obtaining 33%, however he couldn't cut down on the difference reached by Jalil. With this result, the current mayor of the capital of the Province, who had the support of the current governor of the Province, reaffirmed the control of the Peronist Party in this district.

PROVINCE OF LA RIOJA

The provincial representative, part of the Frente de Todos, Ricardo Quintela obtained a wide advantage over the candidate of Juntos por el Cambio, Julio Martínez. The other representative from the Peronist Party in the Province was close to 20%, which shows the importance of this party in the district. The current governor, Sergio Casas, who wasn't allowed to run for his reelection, was finally elected as national representative as part of the Frente de Todos bloc.
